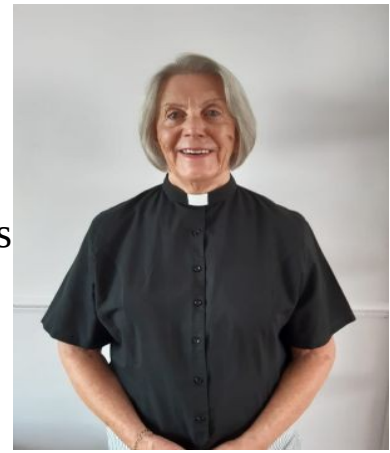

# A message from Margaret

## The Hope of Easter

What are you are hoping for? Throughout our lives there are so many times our thoughts or conversations begin with “I hope....” It might be a hope for something relatively unimportant such as hoping for good weather so you can go out for a walk or dry the laundry outside. It might be a hope to see someone close to you very soon or it can be something for others – hoping a friend who is ill gets better quickly or a young person in the family passes an important examination. These and all our worldly hopes are based on circumstances, a wishful thinking, because we know full well that they may or may not happen as we would like. The “hope” of Easter however, is different because it is based on God's faithfulness.



Throughout scripture we hear of God's promises being fulfilled which gives us confidence that God doesn't go back on his word and Easter is one of those promises being fulfilled in Jesus. Through his death and resurrection which had been foretold centuries before, we are offered a new life within God's kingdom here on earth, where, with sins forgiven, death is but a door to life with God eternally. In this world we are still subject to the consequences of wrong choices and decisions made by others as well as ourselves, but it is within God's kingdom that we can find peace no matter what is going on around us.

As I write, war is still raging in the middle east, also between Russia and Ukraine as well as armed conflicts in some parts of Africa. By the time you read this, things may have escalated or the worst may be over with peace returning. My hope - i.e. desire - is that it will be the latter, but at present the outcome is uncertain. However, despite fearful world events,

my Christian “hope” is in God because as Jesus promised, he “will be with us, to the end of the age.” (Matthew 28:20). His strength, renewal, guidance and above all peace, will help us through even the most difficult situations.

I am reminded of an affirmation of faith written by the *Iona Community* which begins:

*We believe that God is present in the darkness before the dawn; in the waiting and the uncertainty where fear and courage join hands, conflict and caring link arms, and the sun rises over barbed wire. We believe in a with-us God who sits down in our midst to share our humanity.*

I would add that I believe in God who keeps his promises even to the point of death on a cross so we can rise with him forgiven and free. I believe God will remain faithful despite discouraging, fearful or chaotic world events and no matter what personal difficulties we face.

May you place your hope fully in God this Easter and live in his promises.

## Tresham Benefice Fellowship

Well no one was disappointed with Jess Henderson's talk on being the first London female bus driver in the 70's. Members and visitors were entertained for two hours while Jess gave them her background. She started as a conductor in Northampton reminding them of the ticket machines and the day she caught a women's red haired wig in the machine. Then she joined the Ambulance service taking people to and from hospital. In 1976 women had more equality so she applied once again to be a driver but she was told she wasn't tall enough (Jess is 5ft 2ins) but she persevered and eventually she was invited to take lessons.

The first time she hit the kerb three times and on November 7<sup>th</sup> 1977 she took her test. It was snowing in London that day and she passed with flying colours. Her first outing was in a single decker in Hitchin, in thick snow, as the Gritter drivers were on strike. She couldn't get up a hill so a local farmer offered to tow her and he took the front of the bus off, she slid down the hill and collided with a lorry and took the back of the bus off!

She went on to regale us with such hilarious stories. A couple I will tell here: She had a hospital patient offer her two pints of milk as he stood naked on his way to the Mental Hospital, he said he was a psychiatrist and late for work.

Another time a briefcase full of money was left on the bus; two Arabs claimed it but two guys with baseball bats and a huge knife chased them off.

Jess was eventually promoted to Inspector of Revenue which entailed checking that all the money taken was being accounted for. One night shift she had to call the police with a dog, as a guy was urinating on the

bus, he was obviously drunk and as he got off the bus he jumped into the police van so the police had to send the dog in.

Because Jess had to really use all her strength to steer buses such as the Routemaster, her knees were affected so the Bus Company retired her on full pension at the age of 55. Unfortunately her husband died the same year. Living in Daventry, aged 57, she was bored so she signed up as a bus driver in Rugby for four years, doing 12 hour shifts, where she met her new husband.

She stopped driving and had a knee replacement and after her recovery she drove a voluntary minibus taking patients for hospital visits, until 2009. Jess is now a driving instructor for minibus drivers where Colin met her.

Jess was married five times and lost a daughter who was only 25 years old. So I hope I have given you just an idea of how much Jess entertained the Fellowship.

Colin is in the process of drawing up the 2026 outings and will tell members more at the AGM on March 19<sup>th</sup>. Please remember your £5 membership fee and those of you who are going to Tolthorpe in July, he will need your £27, which includes travel on the minibus.

## Independent Examiner

Whilst Holy Trinity is not a registered charity as such, we are considered a charity by HMRC and enjoy some of the benefits accorded to charities which are registered. We do not have our accounts audited but we are required to have them what is referred to as independently examined.

Since 2012 the accountancy firm Azets (as well as under previous names) branch in Kettering has acted as our independent examiner. They have always been professional and carried out their examination in a timely fashion, and I have no complaints whatsoever about the service they have provided.

What Azets are not is cheap. And with the pressure on parish finances we are looking for someone appropriately qualified who would be prepared to act as our independent examiner on a more informal, i.e. cheaper, basis.

Women's World Day of Prayer was set up in the United States in 1887, an International ecumenical Christian laywomen's initiative for informal prayer and prayerful action. All are welcome, all are welcome, all are welcome in this place”

We heard the stories of four Nigerian women, one bullied at school, one living where girls are kidnapped for being Christian, another coping with abject poverty, and lastly one for whom widowhood meant losing her place in society. For all of them prayerful support has given them a new perspective, they are accepted and happy.

It was inspiring to hear about these women finding love and support in their everyday lives, and for us to realise that we have so much for which to give thanks.

Next year the service is to be based on United in Justice and Peace.

“George, the Lord is risen!” I said with suitably uncontained enthusiasm. He replied, in a rather gruff and unimpressed voice, “I know.”



## Point to Ponder

Easter is the annual festival in the Christian Calendar whereby we are reminded God keeps His faith in his Creation. After the dreadful treatment of Jesus at the hands of his fellow humanity - symbolised forever in that Roman instrument of execution, the cross, we would expect some retribution from the Creator.

Yet even in this example of “*man’s inhumanity to man,*” God answers Jesus’ prayer “*Father forgive them for they know not what they do*” (Luke 23 v 34) with HIS forgiveness. After Jesus dies and is buried there is a new awareness of the depth of God’s love for the world. His people will spread the wonderful news that we are all made for time and for eternity.

The resurrection of Jesus from the tomb has added a new dimension in what it means to be alive. We can all bring something of heaven in our love for one another. God has exposed the strength behind the reality of forgiveness in the way we can bring peace, harmony, and beauty into human existence. We are not created to make revenge a virtue and a way of life.

Moses reminds us that vengeance lies with God (Deuteronomy 32:35) and we should not usurp God’s place in the universe by thinking otherwise. St Paul reminds us to put revenge to the back of our minds and overcome evil with good. (Romans 12: 19-21)

Human relationships at every level are cruelly stunted by revenge and ill will. The current conflicts that beset us, like those in the past, do nothing to enhance our humanity or our wellbeing. Martin Luther King (1928-68) the great American civil rights activist and martyr, challenges us today in his words “*man must evolve for all human conflicts a method*

*which rejects revenge, aggression, and retaliation. The foundation of such a method is love.”*

Easter encourages us to bring forgiveness into our living and into our awareness of our fellow humanity. Life is a wonderful bundle of opportunities to open new doors in what we can do to help others. There is some good in the worst of us and some evil in the best of us. When we discover this, we are less prone to hate and more inclined to know more about other people.

There is a richness in the Festival of Easter not just in a bit of self-indulgence but also in building bridges between us and others. We can be inspired by the beauty of flowers and blossoms and feel uplifted by the whole concept of new life. There is hope to encourage us and joy to make us open our eyes to the future. Forgiveness will not bury the past and its mistakes, but it will enable us to see that there is a future to pursue.

As Percy Dearmer, the hymn writer puts it “*O free the world from blindness and fill the world with kindness, give sinners resurrection, bring striving to perfection.*”

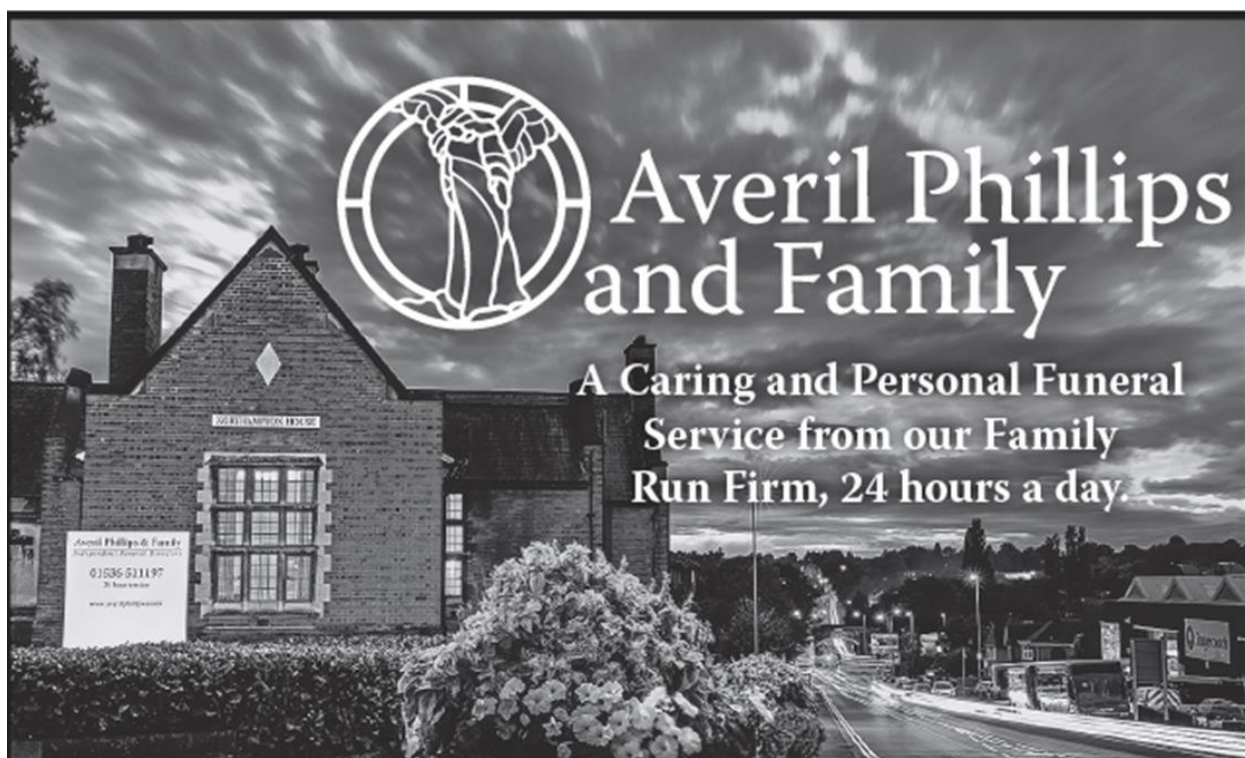
