A message from Andy

If Lent had a vibe, it might be “*spiritual reset.*” For forty days, Christians all over the world trade a few comforts for deeper focus, stepping onto a path that leads to Easter morning. It’s reflective, yes - but it doesn’t have to be gloomy. In fact, if you’re looking for a surprisingly practical, down-to-earth guide for the season, look no further than the book to the Colossians.



Colossians is short - just four chapters - but it packs a punch. Imagine a small church community trying to figure out what really matters while surrounded by loud opinions, spiritual trends, and self-improvement advice. Sound familiar? Into that swirl of confusion comes a bold reminder: Christ is enough. Not Christ plus hustle. Not Christ plus aesthetic spirituality. Just Christ.

That message hits differently during Lent. When you give up chocolate, social media, or that daily oat milk skinny latte, you start to notice how quickly you reach for substitutes - comfort snacks, distraction scrolling, endless noise. Colossians gently calls that out. It reminds readers that Jesus isn’t an accessory to life; he’s the centre of it. “*In him all things hold together,*” the letter proclaims. Which is good news when your self-control starts unravelling by week two.

But Lent isn’t just about quitting things. It’s about swapping them out. Colossians uses wardrobe language: take off anger, malice, greed - the stuff that doesn’t fit your new life - and put on compassion, kindness, humility, patience. It’s like a spiritual closet clean-out. Sure, you can fast from sugar. But what if you also fast from sarcasm? What if you give up resentment and replace it with forgiveness? That’s where Lent gets real.

One of the most relatable lines in Colossians says your life is “*hidden with Christ in God.*” In a world obsessed with visibility - followers, likes, personal brands - that’s almost rebellious. Lent invites you to embrace hidden growth. No applause. No announcement. Just quiet transformation.

And here’s the twist: Colossians is full of gratitude. It keeps circling back to thankfulness, singing, joy. That may not be the tone we expect from a season that begins with ashes. But Lent isn’t about wallowing; it’s about preparing. It clears space so joy can land deeper.

So as you navigate cravings, calendar chaos, and maybe a few failed fasts, let Colossians walk with you. It keeps things simple in the best way: Christ is supreme. Christ is sufficient. And with him at the centre, even forty days of self-denial can feel surprisingly freeing!

If Colossians is something you want to learn more about, then join *Churches Together in Rothwell* as we meet weekly to study Colossians, starting in Holy Trinity Church Rothwell on Wednesday 25th February at 7pm, or if a morning works better, we are also running the same course from Friday 27th February at Rothwell Methodist Church at 10.30am. This is a 5 week course so don’t worry if you missed the first one.

Lent 2026 – ‘Draw Near’

Lent is traditionally a time when Christians take time to reflect what it means to be a follower of Jesus and to prepare for the celebrations of Easter. This year, the Church of England has produced some materials under the heading, ‘Draw Near’, to help us develop some life-giving habits that will help us in our daily lives to draw nearer to Jesus.



Throughout the bible we read of people who encounter Jesus in amazing ways and whose lives are transformed. Often the story ends there, but of course, that is just the start of the journey. As followers of Jesus, we know that the journey continues as we build on our relationship with and understanding of God. Central to the journey lie certain habits that can help us: worshipping together, praying, reading and exploring the bible, sharing communion, offering service to those around us, and sharing the good news we have come to discover.

I wonder, this Lent, what you might focus on to deepen your own discipleship and nurture your spiritual life. As we draw near to God, he draws near to us and we can know his presence with us more fully. As Richard of Chichester prayed: *‘may we know thee more clearly, love thee more dearly, and follow thee more nearly, day by day.’*

Point to Ponder

The appointment of Sarah Mullally as the first female Archbishop of Canterbury is for many the logical progression of the ministry of women in the Church.

Her enthronement on March 25th is of historical importance as well as theological significance. It is an event that opens a little wider our understanding of the inclusive nature of the love of God which the church exists to proclaim and encourage both in the world as well as in the believer.

The Church does have the courage of its convictions when it proclaims that God's love extends to every corner of the universe, but that love needs to be lived and shown in human existence to be valid. It also proclaims God's acceptance and love of the diversity found in human relationships. The last few decades have seen many changes in the Church and in our Christian understandings of that diversity from the marriage of the divorced to the ordination of women, to name but two heated debates!

St Paul reminds us in his first letter to the Church in Corinth (Chapter 13 verses 12 and 13) that we are all part of an ongoing process in human nature whereby we have to come to terms with change in our grasp of God's constant revealing of His love for us and our love for one another. *“Now we see only puzzling reflections in a mirror but then we shall see face to face. My knowledge now is partial: then it will be whole, like God's knowledge of me. In a word, there are three things that last for ever, faith, hope, and love: but the greatest of them all is love.”*

Our new Archbishop will have to help us all continue the task of recognising and enabling those who have yet to feel that there is a place for them in God's scheme of things.

There is still more to be done to extend the message of God's acceptance of his undiluted love for His created humanity. As Dianne Warwick the singer puts it, "*What the world needs now, is love sweet love. It is the only thing that it is just too little of. What the world needs now, is love sweet love; no not just for some but for everyone.*" (Hal David and Burt Bacharach 1965)

We need to hear of God's love in all sorts of ways to help us live life to the full and celebrate our existence. A new Archbishop can set the tone of that love in her messages to the church at home and abroad. Her historical position helps that message to be listened to.

Archbishop Sarah will be expected to do many things and say many things. She may not be able to solve every challenge that confronts her ministry. But if she can bring the age-old truth of a loving God into a heartbroken world, she will have all our prayers and love.


