Seeing things differently

August is a month that brings us 'the summer'... now I don't know about you but I often find myself wondering what that will mean, will it be full on heat of summer, torrential rain, cloudy cool days or all of the above!



We will simply have to wait and see and whatever faces us we will no doubt adapt whatever we are doing to fit the situation as best we can.

This sense of the need to adapt and see things differently brings to mind Bartholomew, one of Jesus 12 disciples, mentioned in the gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke. John's gospel never mentions Bartholomew but does mention Nathanael (the others don't) so many think that Bartholomew and Nathanael are the same person.

I love Nathanael's first encounter with Jesus. Philip comes and tells him about Jesus of Nazareth to which Nathanael replies 'Can anything good come out of Nazareth?' It's a slightly grumpy response, maybe like those hoping for a lovely summer holiday weather in August, he's been let down a few times before.

Still, what happens next is a story of being completely turned around. Jesus tells Nathanael that he saw him under the fig tree before Philip called him. Nathanael is so surprised by this he changes from sceptic to believer, and even more than Philip had said. Nathanael says to Jesus "you are the Son of God! You are the King of Israel."

There are many times when we are sceptical or doubt, but when we meet Jesus for ourselves our outlook can be transformed, when we realise we are known and loved by Jesus it changes everything.

Come rain or shine this August I pray you find some time to meet Jesus in the pages of the Bible, in the family of the church, in a quiet place (like Nathanael's fig tree) where you are seen and loved.

Point to Ponder

When the atomic bombs were dropped on the Japanese cities of Nagasaki and Hiroshima on August 6th and 8th 1945, the six years of the Second World War shuddered to an end.

The ensuing devastation of these cities brought new and terrifying dimensions into our understanding and experience on war and the effects of these weapons on the victims and the environment. This was the only time the nations of the world could step back and see what atomic weapons could do.

It was estimated that the death toll was in the region of 300,000+. Countless civilians suffered indescribable injuries, and the effects of radiation poisoning can still be seen today.

The debate on the ethical and legal justification for the bombings remains unresolved in the minds of scholars of international law, in political and moral thinkers and with religious leaders.

One of the basic points of view prevalent at the time was that the bombings were justified because of the time it was going to take to defeat the enemy or the revulsion at the way the war was being conducted in some places. There will be sad memories in many homes this month as there are from any conflict.

However, we need to learn from past mistakes and not repeat them. That is why the reports of the effects of the bombings not only make for some very harrowing reporting but should be the bedtime reading of those political leaders who are tempted to use atomic weapons as a means of achieving their aims.

We are living in dangerous times which need wise and far-sighted world leaders to guide the nations under their charge. President John F Kennedy reminded us at the height of the Cuban Crisis in the 1960's "mankind must put an end to war or war will put an end to mankind."

Like Kennedy we are all children of the atomic age, and we bear an inescapable burden to ensure that our beloved planet is not destroyed by the folly of conflict, national greed, and fear. As Jesus reminds us "blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called the children of God" (Matthew 5 verse 9).

As well as being an opportunity to call the nations to prayer it is to be hoped that the *VJ Day of Remembrance* on August 15th, through its celebrations and thanksgivings, will provide everyone with an opportunity to renew our faith in the presence of courage and fortitude in the human heart, real service to others in the family of the nations irrespective of colour, creed and birth, and hope in the destiny of human concerns for one another as we go about our daily lives.

On the Cenotaph in Hiroshima are the words "*Rest in Peace*. *The mistake shall not be repeated*." These words must surely be a clear call to all the nations to work together and enjoy this happy and wonderful vision for the future generations.


