It is run by the UK charity my Society and was launched in 2007.

The great thing is you don't need to know who's responsible for fixing your problem. You just put a pin on a map, and **FixMyStreet** sends your report to the right council.

Problems are also published on the **FixMyStreet** website, so you can browse your local area and see what the prevalent problems are and what's been fixed.

You can also upload a photo to help show what the issue is.

Once you've sent your report, it goes straight to the council, who will get back in touch with you directly.

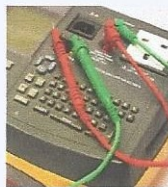

Over £60,000 awarded to projects supporting Rushton and Pipewell's residents

Since April 2024, £61,436.89 has been awarded to local organisations who are providing services and support to Rushton and Pipewell residents through the New Albion Community Benefit Wind Farm Fund. A range of different projects have received funding over the last 10 months, including a grant to enable the D-Day Celebration, improvements to Rushton Village Hall and to local public footpath access.

The most recent grant funding awards have been made to the following projects: Rushton Parish Council has been awarded over £11,000 to refurbish a bus shelter and to maintain and improve radar speed signs, Rushton Pocket Park have been awarded over £4,000 to help maintain the area and the Parochial Church Council of All Saints' have been awarded over £6,000 to improve floodlighting and security.

The New Albion Community Benefit Wind Farm Fund is now closed to new applications until next year, however, Northamptonshire Community Foundation have a range of other grant funding programmes available which might be able to support your local organisation. If you are part of, or know of, a locally managed voluntary or community group in Rushton or Pipewell, get in touch with the Grants Team at Northamptonshire Community Foundation to find out more about the available grant funding.

Repairs and upgrading of All Saints' church Rushton floodlights.

All Saints' P.C.C. has been awarded £6791.00 to repair and improve the floodlighting of the Rushton village church.

Rushton, All Saints' P.C.C. has been awarded funding from Northamptonshire Community Foundation through the New Albion Wind Farm Fund to support the repairs and improvements to the church floodlighting scheme.

The project consists of repair and upgrading of the existing church floodlighting installation and the provision of a mains powered security alarm modem along with associated works to bring the electrical installation into compliance with current legislation.

The existing floodlights were installed in 1994 to mark the centenary of the formation of Parish Councils in England. The Rushton Parish Council donated the eight 70-Watt SON floodlights and associated installation materials to include cabling and electrical controls.

Local volunteer labour from Rushton carried out the trenching, cable installation and floodlight base formation. A NICEIC approved electrical contractor provided all connections, testing and commissioning.

This installation, with regular maintenance, served the parish well for nearly thirty years. However, during Christmas 2022 the installation developed a fault and required at least 6 of the luminaires to be replaced due to age and weathering.

The P.C.C. felt that it was time to replace all the old 70-Watt SON luminaires with modern LED 50-Watt type floodlights. In doing so electrical usage would be reduced by 60% and lessen the church carbon footprint.

The electrical mains and distribution required upgrading to comply with BS7671:2018+A2:2022 and Health & Safety legislation. Also, a 230v connection point will be installed in the bell chamber for a mains-powered security modem. This is to be provided by GBSG who monitor the church with sensors and cameras.

Kevin J Abraham – Churchwarden said: *'The community has missed the floodlighting of this important medieval Grade II* listed building. It lights*

up a dark area of the village. We can now resume the sponsorship scheme where parishioners are able to dedicate the lighting of the church on specific nights to loved ones, birthdays, and anniversaries etc.'

Rachel McGrath Grants Director/Deputy CEO said: *'The Foundation is delighted to have awarded **All Saints' P.C.C.** funding to carry out a much-needed project in their locality. We wish them every success in their endeavours by helping to improve the quality of life for local communities.'*

POINT TO PONDER FOR DECEMBER 2024

I remember some years ago a “modern” nativity play was performed in our Church. Joseph was depicted as a scruffy but good-natured bloke and Mary was revealed as a young unmarried mother to be. They did not have the means to book accommodation at the local Travel Lodge and the manager of the local squat found a space for the new baby to be born in his garage. Not everyone approved of this updated version of the birth of Jesus! One observer complained to me “whatever have you done to the beautiful story of Mary and Joseph and Jesus and the stable?”

The account of the birth of Jesus by St Luke (Luke 2:1-20) is not presented in a nice, sentimental, or pleasant way as often found in medieval paintings or Christmas cards .No mention is made of ‘cattle lowing’ or ‘stars in the bright sky’ or even of a little donkey! The accommodation for the family was dark, dank, and smelly for there was ‘no room for them in the inn.’ We are told three times by St. Luke that the newborn infant was wrapped in strips of cloth and that his crib was a manger.

We can desensitise and disinfect the story of the birth of Jesus if we never read it for ourselves or to our children or listen to it in a Church. This story like many in the Bible is forever contemporary in the issues it raises or in the human dilemmas with which they confront us.

Forty years ago, we were challenged by the pop stars who encouraged us to “Feed the world,” today we are still faced with the homeless, the starving and the cries of the little children from the war zones and famine struck areas in many parts of the world.” Nativity plays” are never out of date if there are people who want to destroy or ignore their fellow human beings. They should carry a spiritual health warning if we believe they have a message for us and an incentive to act upon them. We are not given such stories to amuse us but as windows to see into the mind of God. The birth of Jesus enables us to discover as to what is expected of us to love the world into a better state and how we are to restore our human dignity.

At Christmas we recall in our carols the love God has for all that has been created. We embrace the truth that everyone is precious in His heart and like Mary we “ponder in our mind God’s wondrous love in saving lost mankind.” (John Byrom 1691-1763) God’s people must never take that truth for granted or distort it but proclaim it anew in every generation.

Christmas is a wonderful opportunity to remind us how the power of love, revealed into the dark and unworthy places into which Jesus was born, can still transform our world today.

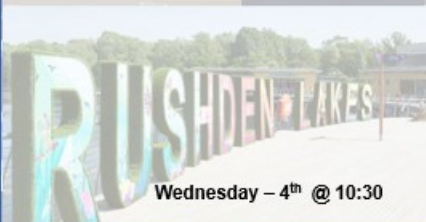

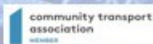
