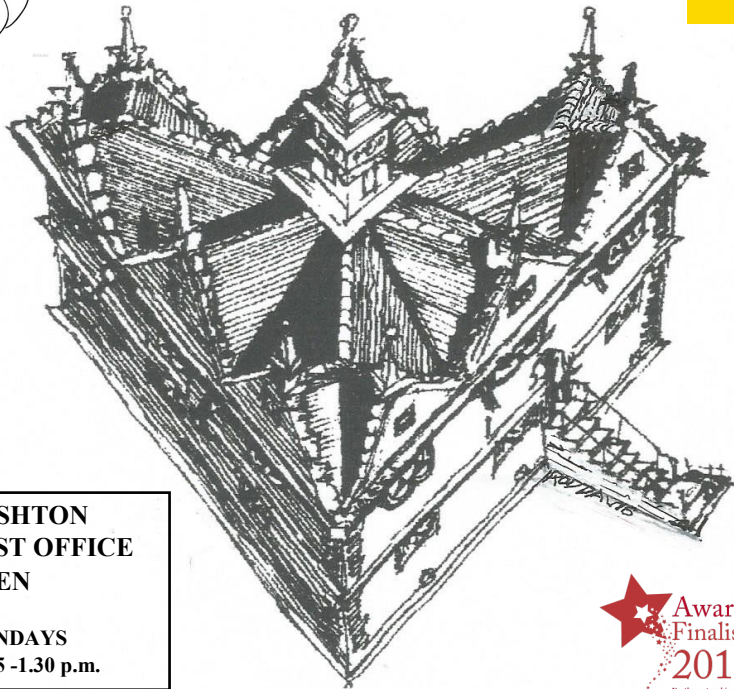

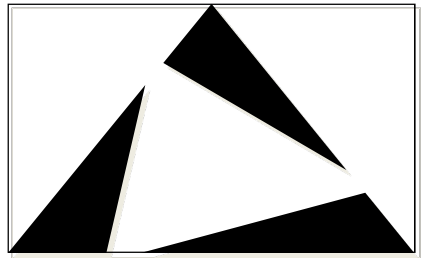

Have you noticed how some of our local roads are reducing in size? One very good example is the road to Newton and Geddington. The first part of the road is very good, because it leads to Camgrain. There are white lines, kerbstones and it is plenty wide enough for two vehicles. From that point, it is no longer the pleasant country lane that it once was, providing a safe route to the villages of Newton and Geddington. The verges are completely rutted, thus narrowing the road, so that in places, it is now almost single track. If a van or larger vehicle approaches from the opposite direction, you have to hold your breath and hope that your wing mirror stays intact, and that you are not going to be shoved into a rut, thus popping a tyre, which has happened to people on numerous occasions. It's bad in daylight, and even worse in the dark. The advent of bigger cars, GPS shortcuts, a huge increase in the number of vans racing to deliver parcels, and drivers who drive at 60 m.ph., whatever the conditions, just because it is technically legal to do so - they are all responsible for this motoring hell. The roads to Desborough and Rothwell fall into the same category. If you read the article on pages 14 and 15, you will see that Rushton Parish Council is trying to find a way to improve the problems that we have locally. Rushton has gone from being a quiet little village to a universal thoroughfare for motorists. Sign the petition and make your views known - it's a starting point. The number of cars is going to continue to increase - but our village and local roads are at the threshold of disaster now.

Report on Road Issues in Rushton Parish

Dear Rushton Parishioners,

I have compiled a comprehensive report on the persistent and wide-ranging issues affecting the road network within Rushton Parish. These challenges have been repeatedly brought to attention by local residents and include the following:

- Increasing levels of traffic through the Parish
- Speeding Vehicles
- Potholes and deteriorating road surfaces
- Severe congestion at school times
- Inadequate or poorly sited road signs
- Overgrown Hedges and Grass Verges
- Flooding Due to Inadequate Drainage
- Poor Road Maintenance:
- Inadequate Street Lighting:
- Poor visibility at critical junctions and locations
- Insufficient street lighting
- Obstructive parking on pavements and roadways
- Lack of pedestrian safe walking routes
- Noise pollution from heavy vehicles and increased traffic

Although these problems differ in nature they are closely linked. Influencing factors such as driver behaviour, diverted traffic and mounting pressures from ongoing development are placing considerable strain on roads that were not originally built to cope with present-day traffic volumes.

Given the extent of these issues, I respectfully requested that the Parish Council formally recognise this document as an accurate record of the current road-related challenges facing Rushton Parish. Furthermore, I propose that the report be submitted to North Northamptonshire Council and other relevant stakeholders. The Parish council unanimously agreed to

support this initiative. The intended outcome is to encourage meaningful action to address and resolve the difficulties currently impacting our community.

This report is also created to assist efforts to prevent further growth in commuting traffic through Rushton Parish, a trend fuelled by both current and future housing and commercial developments.

The report will be published on the Rushton Parish Council's website for public review in January. The document is intended to be a current record regularly reviewed and updated to reflect any changes or newly emerging issues within the parish.

During the Parish Council meeting in July two residents from High Street, Rushton attended, and expressed their concerns about speeding vehicles, dangerous driving, and poor parking in their area, a common theme in our community, It was recommended that organising a petition signed by local residents and submitting it directly to Northamptonshire Council would be the most effective way to achieve results.

In response to these ongoing concerns and considering all the issues included in the report I have prepared a petition as a parishioner. The petition specifically refers to each of the problems outlined above and aims to collect signatures from fellow parishioners. Once sufficient support is gathered the petition will be submitted to Northamptonshire Council. This effort is intended to complement the Parish Council's submission and highlight our (the parishioners of Rushton Parish) collective frustration with the worsening state of the road network.

We are fortunate to have a number of willing volunteers who have agreed to take the petition door to door to gather signatures. If any other parishioners wish to assist with this important initiative, your participation would be greatly appreciated.

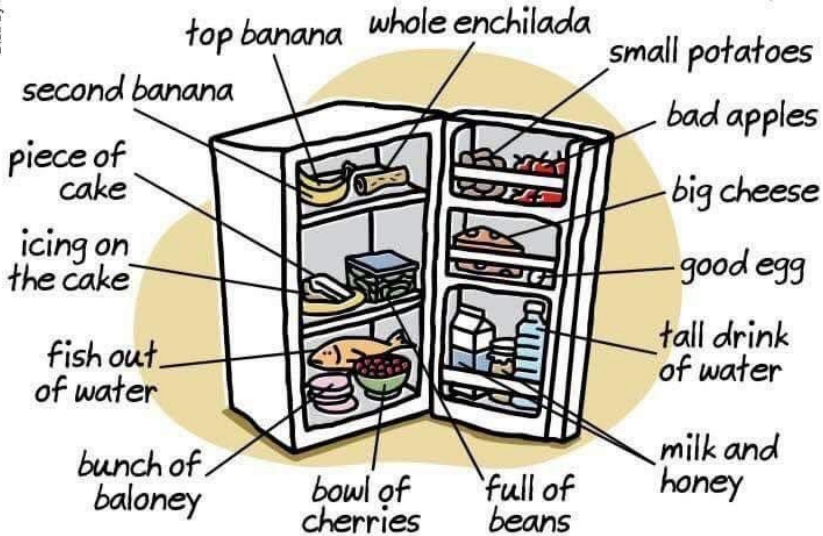

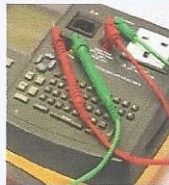

A Happy New Year to everyone in Rushton, and to all those who visit or help to maintain this natural haven. It will not be long before the snowdrops start to flower, so it's worth braving the cold and rather dreary weather to visit the Pocket Park. There will be catkins too, and everywhere you look, there are early signs of life.

Once again, we have the intelligentsia of the pheasant and partridge population! Among birds of little brain, these Darwinian exemplars seem to know that it is safe, and that they will live to fight another day!

The new season is beginning - it is the ideal time to prune the hedges, tidy up and observe how birds and insects make their way throughout the winter months. We have large populations of blue tits, who skitter round collecting tiny morsels of food, which hide beneath the winter foliage and brushwood. They frequently adjourn to neighbouring gardens to find a drink or have a bath. This is essential for their survival. Occasionally, a drift of long-tailed tits tweet their way through - such delightful little birds. There are also wrens, robins, sparrows and a kite is often to be seen wheeling overhead. We won't mention the sp...wh..k, which whips through to pick up a takeaway lunch from time to time. Nature is brutal!

As St Paul writes “for now we see in a mirror, dimly.” (I Corinthians 13:13) There needs to be an honest admission in our hearts that we should approach the future with a generous magnanimity in our attitudes. As Jesus says to his disciples “unless you become as little children you will never see the kingdom of God.” (Matthew 18:3) Are we going to be content with half-truths or real solutions? There is plenty of room in our thinking for ideas to take root and develop on how to improve our humanity for the betterment of all. With magnanimity we can develop the strength to refuse to be petty-minded and self-centred about the things that challenge us and our world. There are many compelling causes that cry out for our support. There is also plenty of time to have an honest candour about the mistakes made by the authorities and ask some tough questions about decisions made in our name.” We owe this hope to our wonderful universe, our human integrity and as stewards of God’s creation. As the Psalmist describes our status as seen through God’s eyes “What are human beings that you are mindful of them, and mortals that you care for them? Yet you have made them a little lower than God and crowned them with glory and honour. You have given them dominion over the works of your hands; you have put all things under their feet.” (Psalm 8 :4-6) As Tom Stoppard reminds us in his definition of truth, we are all only halfway there. However, we can work out the fulness of truth in experience and in living. Wisdom is found in the way we treat one another, and knowledge will come into its own when we look at the world as God sees it. The fulness of life will be achieved and the virtues of kindness and honesty and happiness will be ours when we care for those God has placed into the circle of our care and concern. The truth we all seek to follow, and which gives us peace, lies within ourselves. That is why we must wish one another “a happy new year! “
