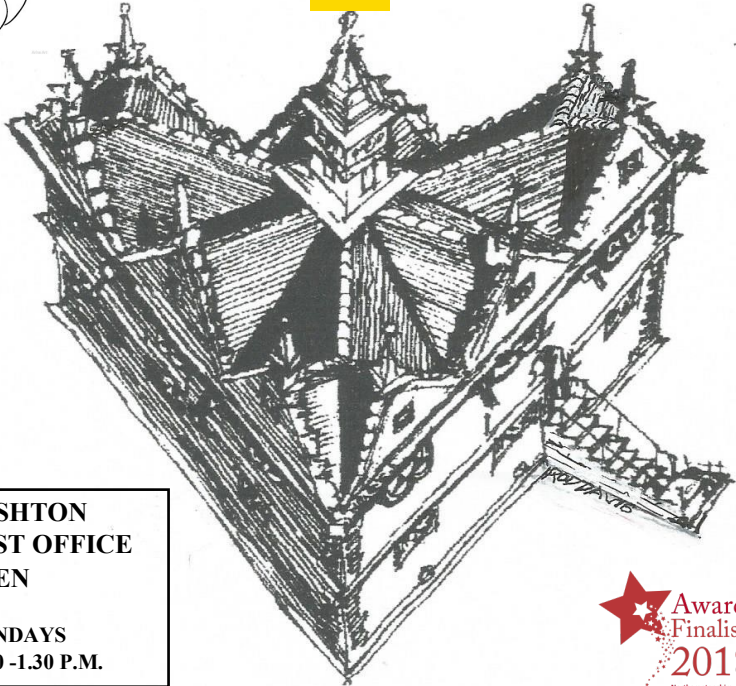

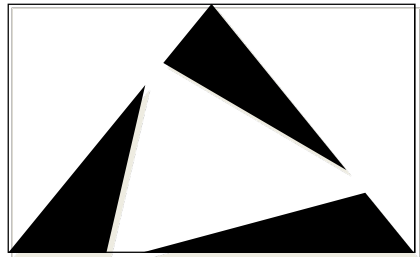

LOCAL ORGANISATIONS AWARDED

£26,768 THROUGH THE NEW

ALBION COMMUNITY WIND FARM FUND

The New Albion Wind Farm Fund was established to provide funding support to a range of charitable, educational, environmental and general community amenity projects for the benefit of Rushton & Pipewell residents.

A total of **£26,768** was awarded at a community grants panel in June of this year, funding two community projects. **Rushton Parish Council** received **£13,048** to make improvements to public footpaths by replacing existing stiles with kissing gates, which will look to make the paths more accessible for members of the community whilst still ensuring livestock can be contained. **Rushton Village Hall** was awarded **£13,720** to carry outside essential repairs, maintenance and security improvements to the venue, helping to ensure this vital community asset can continue to be used. If you're part of a small, locally managed, voluntary, community or self-help group, and you're looking to set up a new project or build upon the good work you do already, you could be awarded a grant of up to £10,000 through the New Albion Community Wind Farm Fund. 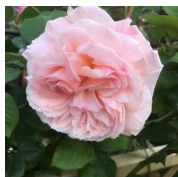

The great thing is you don't need to know who's responsible for fixing your problem. You just put a pin on a map, and **FixMyStreet** sends your report to the right council.

Problems are also published on the **FixMyStreet** website, so you can browse your local area and see what the prevalent problems are and what's been fixed.

You can also upload a photo to help show what the issue is.

Once you've sent your report, it goes straight to the council, who will get back in touch with you directly.

Rushton Village Proposed Bus Shelter Refurbishment works.

You may have noticed that The Rushton Village Bus Shelter located on Station Road opposite the Thornhill Arms is looking rather tatty, and the notice board located in the shelter is in a poor condition. Therefore, it is proposed to refurbish the Bus Shelter and replace the old notice board.



Notice Board

A new triple section notice board will provide two notice posting sections and one section that will contain a village map. The new notice board will be the same model as the existing man-made timber (recycle plastic) parish notice boards. The notice board will be semi recessed into the back panel and will be attached onto a new timber support frame fitted to the structural supports of the bus shelter. The feather edge boarding will be cut and fitted around the notice board.

Bus Shelter

The back panel feather edge boarding will be repaired or replaced and painted leaving approximately a 150mm gap from ground level at the bottom of the boarding. This will ensure that rubbish cannot collect behind the back panel in the future.

The steel support structure of the shelter will be repainted and any repairs necessary to the roof timbers or felt or fascia boards will be carried out.

Village Map

The artist designed Illustrated Village map will be fixed directly into the center section of the new notice board. This map will provide location information to visitors and the lost delivery drivers.

Seating

A lattice type wooden bench will be attached to the wooden framework and be supported by steel legs bolted to the ground surface. The bench will be the full width of the bus shelter providing seating for person(s) waiting for the bus.

Lighting

The lighting level within the area of the existing bus shelter is very low making it almost impossible to read the information within the noticeboard after dusk or in poor weather conditions. We are currently looking into providing lighting in the Bus Shelter, it will depend on being able to access a local street lighting power supply or finding a suitable solar lighting system.

Image of Proposed Layout

Following the Parish Councils approval, we are currently making an application to The New Albion Windfarm Fund for a grant to fund this work.

Radar Speed Sign (RSS) Proposal

Overview

In October 2018 with a grant from Northamptonshire Community Foundation Rushton Parish Council purchased and installed three Radar Speed Signs. These units were installed in three locations within Rushton Parish.

1. Station Road Rushton (Outside the School)
2. Desborough Road Rushton
3. Oakley Road Pipewell

These units indicate to approaching drivers their speed on a display board. The speed is displayed in green when drivers are within the speed limit and red when in excess of speed limit acting as a deterrent to slow vehicles down and reminding the drivers of the speed limit. These units also record the speeds of vehicles in either direction. This information is regularly downloaded and stored.

The collected data provides the Parish Council with an overview of the numbers of vehicles passing the camera units in both directions, the speeds, dates and times.

The Parish Council continues to provide this information to the police to identify areas that require additional speed enforcement.

A summary of collected data is also published in the Rushton Parish Magazine (The Triangle).

One area in Rushton Village that is not covered by these speed cameras is the West section of Station Road from Desborough Road to the Junction of High Street at the Thornhill Arms.

Many Parishioners have reported their concerns at the excess speed of vehicles in this section of road particularly approaching the junction where the road narrows and there are parked cars.

In November last year a survey was undertaken by NNC Highways, and it was recommended to relocate the existing RSS in Station Road to the High Street junction to record the speeds of approaching vehicles and attempting to slow down speeding vehicles.

From the information recorded on the Station Road RSS in its current location the speeds of the majority of vehicles do not exceed the speed limit (approximate average speeds of 15 to 18 mph), this is due to the two traffic calming speed humps in the that section of road. The excessively high speeds recorded tend to be during the night time hours.

Proposal

To install a new RSS mounting post in an optimum position to capture approaching vehicles towards this junction.

Relocate the existing RSS unit onto the new mounting post, setup and adjust.

Retaining the existing mounting post allows the RSS to be relocated back to this position in the future if required.

Following the Parish Councils approval, we are currently making an application to The New Alblon Windfarm Fund for a grant to fund this work.

POINT TO PONDER FOR OCTOBER 2024

The formal inquiry into the Grenfell Tower disaster in 2017 opened with these chilling words “All deaths were preventable”. (Sir Martin Moore-Bick, the Chairperson) Will this observation be applied at the proper time to the Post Office Scandal or the Covid Enquiry or the ongoing scandals surrounding the “boat people”? How can there be so much tragedy in the life of our nation? We were all brought up to believe that we live in a society where every person matters but we quickly learn from experience that some people matter more than others. The Grenfell Tower findings endorse such insolence in the way the residents were treated by those in every level of authority who should have been looking after their welfare and safety. That begs the question does the law of the land exist to safeguard people or material wealth and self-interest? What about our own attitudes towards people who are different to ourselves? Jesus is quite clear in his teachings that before God every person matters “Are not five sparrows sold for two pennies? Yet not one of them is forgotten before God.” Why even the hairs on your head are all numbered. Fear not; you are of more value than many sparrows” (see Luke 12:6 and 7.) As we are created in God’s image there can be no hierarchy in the value of our humanity. No one is to be used by another for gain or reward or pride of place. Yet we often seem powerless to prevent this until we challenge one of the oldest sins in The Book which we call “passing the buck.” (see Genesis 3: 12 and 13). Alan Bates did us all a service in his challenges to the fiascos that surrounded the Post Office computers and the human costs that ensued. Our society loses its soul when people are sacrificed on the altar of reputation or profit. A good society should enable us to reach out to one another, care for one another and right the wrongs imposed on us. We all lose something of our humanity if we fail to do so. It is immoral to have a mantra which encourages the saving of taxpayers' money at the cost of endangering taxpayers' lives. Our humanity is ill served when no one takes responsibility for it and many critical issues are often kicked “into the long grass.” We are enduring a spiritual struggle for the soul of our nation. This is going to be also an important concern in the ever-advancing use of AI. The Pope has recently pointed out to us that its use as “an extremely powerful tool” could endanger “understanding of the value and dignity of the human person”. The age-old challenge about being “our brother’s keeper” (Genesis 4:8-9) never goes away. We all must work and pray to safeguard our human rights and encourage one another to face our responsibilities which are unavoidable when we are good citizens.
